Backpack Buddies: Feeding Hungry Children

"I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat."

This well-known gospel passage about helping others (while simultaneously serving Christ in his "distressing disguise" of poverty) is what Backpack Buddies is all about. Our parish began its involvement several years ago when a North Clackamas School District coordinator reached out to Fr. Matthew asking for help, and we have been involved with this local program ever since.

We, along with other churches nearby, raise money, purchase food, and pack the food in take-home bags for select children from Bilquist Elementary School here in Milwaukie who come from homes with a food deficit. In other words, these families often don't have enough food to get through the weekend. So the food the children bring home can help sustain them until Monday comes. Usually, the bags are given out discreetly by the teachers to the needy children at the end of the school day on Fridays.

At COA, we have about 20 volunteers who help throughout the school year with shopping, packing, and delivering the bags to Bilquist. We try to buy healthy foods like tuna, canned chili, milk, and fresh fruit. Funding for the program comes from donations as well as from our parish mission budget.
